

# **BEFORE YOU BEGIN**

Please read and understand this entire manual before attempting to assemble, operate or install this appliance. If you have any questions regarding the product, please contact the retailer.

This manual contains important information about the assembly, operation and maintenance of this LPG Patio Heater. General safety information is presented in the first few pages and is also located throughout this manual. Keep this manual for future reference and to educate new users of this appliance.

# A DANGER

### EXPLOSION-FIRE HAZARD

- Keep solid combustibles, such as building materials, paper, or cardboard a safe distance away from the heater as recommended by the instructions.
- Provide adequate clearances around air openings into the combustion chamber.
- Never use the heater in spaces which do or may contain volatile or airborne combustibles, or products such as gasoline, solvents, paint thinner, dust particles, or unknown chemicals.
- · During operation, this appliance can be a source of ignition. Keep heater area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline, paint thinner, cleaning solvents and other flammable vapors and liquids. Do not use heater in areas with high dust content. Minimum heater clearances from combustible materials: 3 feet/36 inches from top and 2 feet/24 inches from sides.
- Never store propane near high heat, open flames, pilot lights, direct sunlight, other ignition sources, or where temperatures exceed 120° F (49° C).
- Propane vapors are heavier than air and can accumulate in low places. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately.
- · Never install or remove a propane cylinder while the heater is lighted, near flame, pilot lights, or other ignition sources or while heater is hot to the touch.
- · This heater is red hot during use and can ignite flammables too close to the burner. keep flammables at least 3.3 feet/40 inches/1 meter) from top and sides. keep gasoline and other flammable liquids and vapors well away from heater.
- · Store the propane cylinder outdoors in a well-ventilated space out of the reach of children. Never store the propane cylinder in an enclosed area (house, garage, etc.). If heater is to be stored indoors, disconnect the propane cylinder for outdoor storage.



# DANGER

### CARBON MONOXIDE HAZARD

- · This heater is a combustion appliance. All combustion appliances produce carbon monoxide (CO) during the combustion process. This product is designed to produce extremely minute, non-hazardous amounts of CO if used and maintained in accordance with all warnings and instructions. - · During set up, check all connections and fittings for leaks using soapy water, never use a flame to check for leaks.
- · Use as a heating appliance only. Never alter in any way to use with any device.



### WARNING

- · This product is fueled by propane gas. Propane gas is invisible, odorless, and flammable. An odorant is normally added to help detect leaks and can be described as having a "rotten egg" smell. The odorant can fade over time so leaking gas is not always detectable by smell alone.
- · Propane gas is heavier than air and leaking propane will sink to the lowest level possible. It can ignite by ignition sources including matches, lighters, sparks or open flames of any kind many feet away from the original leak. Use only propane gas set up for vapor withdrawal.
- Store and use propane gas in compliance with local ordinances and codes or with ANSI/NFPA 58. Always turn off propane when not in use.
- · Alert children and adults to the hazards of high surface temperatures. Stay away from these surfaces to avoid burning skin or igniting clothing.
- · Carefully supervise young children when in the vicinity of the heater.
- · Do not hang clothing or any other flammable materials from the heater, or place near the heater.
- · Replace any guard or protective device removed for servicing the appliance prior to placing back in service.
- · Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The heater should be inspected before each use, and annually by a qualified service person. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that the control compartment, burners, and circulating air passageway of the appliance be kept clean.

# **A** WARNING

- The installation of this unit must adhere to local codes or Propane Storage and Handling Code, CSA B149.2.
- THIS UNIT IS INTENDED FOR OUTDOOR USE ONLY! This product shall be used outdoors, in a ventilated space and shall not be used in any enclosed area.
- This unit is to be used with propane gas only! (sold separately)
- Do not attach a remote gas supply to this unit.
- · Only use propane gas for this unit.
- This unit is not intended for natural gas.
- Converting this unit to natural gas is dangerous and not recommended. The conversion of this unit will void the manufacturer warranty.
- Do not use any solid fuel or charcoal for this unit.
- If the propane gas tank is leaking gas, you may hear, see, or smell a hiss. Do the following:
- 1. Disconnect the propane gas tank. 2. Do not attempt to fix the problem yourself. 3. Contact your gas supplier or fire department for help.
- Applying too much propane may result in gas pooling and will not burn. Allow fresh air into the unit so that the remaining gas may escape.
- Do not use a flame to check for gas leaks.
- The max. inlet supply pressure: max. Gas supply 11 in w.c. (2.74kPa)
- Use LP propane tanks with the following dimensions: diameter 12 in, height 18 in.
- You must use a propane tank that has a collar to protect the gas valve.
- DO NOT fill tank over 80 percent full.
- The tank system must be set up for vapor withdrawal.
- Discontinue use if any part of the propane tank is damaged. Rust and dents may be hazardous and should be inspected by a gas supplier.
- Do not burn anything other than the provided materials for this patio heater.
- Do not operate unit until all parts are fully assembled.
- Do not paint or color any part of this heating unit.
- Unit may be hot while in use, do not attempt to move it while in use.
- This unit is not intended for cooking.
- Keep any flammable items away.
- Keep a safe distance to avoid burning skin or clothing.
- Do not sit or rest hands or feet on this heating unit.
- Never place hands or fingers on upper portion of this unit while in use.
- Keep all electrical cords and fuel supply hose away from heated surfaces.
- Combustible material should not be within 48 inches of the top of the unit, or within 48 inches around the entire unit.
- Keep the appliance area clear and free from combustible material, gasoline and other flammable vapors and liquids.
- If the flame goes out while burning, turn the gas valve off. Wait 5 minutes before repeating the initial lighting procedure. Once you have a flame started, hold down the control knob for 1 minute.
- Do not add water into the unit.
- Do not operate unit if any part has been under water. Call a service technician to replace any damaged parts should this occur.

# **SAFETY INFORMATION**



- Do not disconnect any part while unit is in use.
- Do not store a spare propane tank on or near this unit.
- If the heating unit is indoors, detach the propane tank and leave outdoors.
- Do not operate on a boat or vehicle. This unit must be used on a flat surface and outdoors ONLY.
- Always remove protective cover before operating (if applicable).
- Check for leaks after not using the unit for long periods of time.
- Children should never operate this unit. Children must be supervised while near this unit.
- Keep gas tank at least 5 feet away from unit when lit. (if external tank)
- The maximum gas supply pressure is 250psi.
- All installation and repair should be done by a qualified professional. This unit should be inspected annually and cleaned regularly.
- Inspect all elements of this heating unit before each use. If there is damage, the burner must be replaced.
- Be aware of the hazards of high temperatures and stay away from the unit to avoid any burns or injury.
- The gas supply tank should be constructed and marked with the specifications for the LP gas tanks of the U.S. Department of Transportation or the National Standard of Canada CAN/CSA-B339, LP gas tanks, spheres and tubes for Transportation of Dangerous Goods; and Commission.
- The LP gas tank must have a listed overflling prevention device and a QCCI or Type I, (CGA791) LP gas tank connection.
- This heating appliance should not be used on plastic or artificial wood decks.
- Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of the appliance.
- Clothing or other flammable materials should not be hung from the appliance or placed on or near the appliance.
- Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the appliance shall be replaced prior to operating the appliance.
- Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually by a qualified service person. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that the control compartment, burners and circulating airways of the appliance are kept clean.


Only use the regulator and hose assembly provided with this unit.

Inspect the burner before use of this unit. If the burner shows any kind of damage, do not operate the appliance.

BE CAREFUL: WHEN CERTAIN MATERIALS OR ITEMS ARE STORED ABOVE, BESIDE OR UNDER THIS HEATER WHILE IN USE, THEY WILL BE SUBJECT TO RADIANT HEAT AND COULD BE SERIOUSLY DAMAGED.


Note: Put screw (KK) through large flat washer (JJ) then through the end link of the retainer chain. Insert screw into hole on front door panel and attach the knob (II)

10.Place the propane gas tank (not included) on the base.

Tighten the belt to ensure the propane gas tank is fully secure.



11. Turn the cylinder valve on the tank clockwise to close the propane tank. Attach the regulator (J) to the cylinder valve by turning the regulator coupling nut clockwise. Make sure it is fastened securely and tighten connections by hand only.






# **Information on Gas Cylinders**

- Use this product only with a LPG vapor withdrawal supply system.
- Storage of the product indoors is permissible only if the cylinder is disconnected and removed from the product. A cylinder must be stored outdoors in a well-ventilated area out of the reach of children. A disconnected cylinder must have dust caps tightly installed and must not be stored in a building, garage or any other enclosed area.
- The pressure regulator and hose assembly supplied with the product must be used.
- Check the hose and regulator before use.
- Inspect the visible hose portion of the regulator before use. Check it completely at least annually.
- Replacements of the hose and regulator must be those specified by the manufacturer.
- The hose and regulator must be UUCSA certified, the outlet pressure of the regulator must be according to the table in the "Specifications" chapter. Suitable spare parts are available from specialist dealers.
- The installation must conform with local codes.
- A dented, rusted or damaged LPG cylinder may be hazardous and should be checked by your LPG supplier. Never use a LPG cylinder with a damaged valve connection.
- The length of the hose cannot exceed 4.6 ft.
- The cylinder must have a listed overfilling prevention device.
- The cylinder must have a connection device compatible with the connection for the product.



- Never fill the cylinder beyond 80 % full.
- Place the dust cap on the cylinder valve outlet whenever the cylinder is not in use. Only install the type of dust cap on the cylinder valve that is provided with the cylinder valve. Other types of caps or plugs may result in leakage of LPG.




- Unscrew the ignition switch button on the control box 3. Install 1 AA battery (not included) with the + polarity end facing OUT.
- Screw the ignition switch button back in.










Regulator / Cylinder Connection



A minimum supply pressure of .5 psi is required for the purpose of input adjustment of propane gas. Storage of an appliance indoors is permissible only if the cylinder is disconnected and removed from the appliance. A cylinder must be stored outdoors in a well-ventilated area out of the reach of children. A disconnected cylinder must have dust caps tightly installed and must not be stored in a building, garage, or any other enclosed area. The minimum permissible gas supply pressure of 11 W.C. is required for the purpose of hose adjustment. The minimum hourly of 1,500 BTU is the required input rating for a heater for automatic operation rating less than full input rating.

The pressure regulator and hose assembly supplied with the appliance must be used.

The installation must conform with local codes, or in the absence of local codes, with national fuel gas code, ANSI Z223.1/NFPA54, natural gas and propane Installation Code, CSA B149.1, or propane storage and handling code, B149.2

A dented rusted or damaged propane cylinder may be hazardous and should be checked by your local cylinder supplier. Never use a propane cylinder with a damaged valve connection. The propane cylinder must be constructed and marked in accordance with the specifications for LP gas cylinders of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) or the standard for cylinders, spheres and tubes for transportation of dangerous goods and commission, CAN/CSA-B339.



- Never connect an unregulated propane cylinder to the heater.



### **LEAK TEST**

- Make 2-3 oz. of leak test solution (one part liquid dish washing detergent and three parts water).
- 2. Apply several drops of solution where hose attaches to regulator.
- Apply several drops of solution where regulator connects to cylinder.
- 4. Make sure all patio heater valves are OFF.
- 5. Turn cylinder valve ON.



### IF BUBBLES APPEAR AT ANY CONNECTION, THERE IS A LEAK.

- 1. Turn cylinder valve OFF.
- 2. If leak is detected at hose/regulator connection, tighten connection and perform another leak test. If bubbles continue to appear, call our customer service hotline at **(866) 985-7877**, 9 a.m. 9 p.m., EST.
- 3. If leak is detected at regulator/cylinder valve connection, disconnect, reconnect, and perform another leak test. If you continue to see bubbles after several attempts, cylinder valve is defective. Call our customer service hotline at **(866) 985-7877**, 9 a.m. 9 p.m., EST.

# IF NO BUBBLES APPEAR AT ANY CONNECTION, THE CONNECTIONS ARE SECURE.

**Note:** Whenever gas connections are loosened or removed, you must perform a complete leak test.

### **BEFORE TURNING GAS SUPPLY ON:**

- Your heater was designed and approved for OUTDOOR use only.
   Do NOT use it inside a building, garage, or any other enclosed area.
- Make sure surrounding areas are free of combustible materials, gasoline, and other flammable vapors or liquids.
- 3. Ensure that there is no obstruction to air ventilation. Be sure all gas connections are tight and there are no leaks.
- 4. Be sure the cylinder cover is clear of debris. Be sure any component removed during assembly or servicing is replaced and fastened prior to starting.

### **BEFORE LIGHTING:**


- Heater should be thoroughly inspected before each use, and by a qualified service person at least annually. If re-lighting a hot heater, always wait at least 5 minutes.
- 2. Inspect the hose assembly for evidence of excessive abrasion, cuts, or wear. Suspected areas should be leak tested. If the hose leaks, replace it prior to operation. Only use the replacement hose assembly specified by the manufacturer.



# **Lighting Instructions**

Before performing a leak test, be sure that no sparks can occur and you are in a spacious outdoor area. Connect the propane gas tank to the regulator and turn the valve on the unit to the "off" position. Brush a soap and water mixture on all connections. Turn the gas supply on; if bubbles occur on any connection there may be a leaklf you smell gas or a leak is discovered turn the gas valve off, disconnect propane gas tank and do not use the appliance until the leak is repaired.

Do not use the heating unit without inspecting the gas hose. If there are signs of wear or abrasion you must replace the hose (if applicable).

# TO TURN THE HEATER ON

WARNING: Please ensure the glass tube has not been damaged before operation

- 1. Ensure the variable control knob is at the OFF position
- 2. Connect the gas regulator to a compatible gas cylinder
- 3. Push and turn the variable control knob to the "Pilot" position and hold for 60 seconds. Whilst still holding the control knob down, press the ignition button. A pilot flame should appear.
- 4. Once the blue pilot flame stays alight constantly, let go of the variable knob.
- 5. Turn the variable control knob to the desired temperature position Lo to Hi

# **IMPORTANT NOTE**

- When lighting the heater for the first time or a new cylinder is connected, the air inside the hose must be purged. This process will take a few minutes as liquefied petroleum gas is heavier than air
- As a result the variable control knob should be pressed down at the Pilot position for 3 Minutes instead of the normal 60 second period
- This ensures the gas purges the air in the hose and passes from the cylinder through to the main burner

### TO TURN THE HEATER OFF

- 1. Turn the variable control to the PILOT position
- 2. Push and turn the variable control knob to the OFF position
- 3. Turn the regulator connected to the gas cylinder to the OFF position





# **OPERATION CHECKLIST:**

For a safe and pleasant heating experience, perform this check before each use:

### **BEFORE OPERATING:**

- I am familiar with entire owner's manual and understand all precautions noted.
- All components are properly assembled, intact and operable.
- No alterations have been made.
- All gas connections are secure and do not leak.
- Wind velocity is below 10 mph.
- Heater is for use outdoors (outside any enclosure).
- There is adequate fresh air ventilation.
- Heater is away from gasoline or other flammable liquids or vapors.
- Heater is away from windows, air intake openings, sprinklers and other water sources.
- Heater has at least 3.3'/40"/1m clearance overhead and on on sides from combustible materials.
- Heater is on a hard and level surface.
- There are no signs of spider or insect nests in heater orifices.
- All burner passages are clear.
- All air circulation passages are clear.
- Clothing or other protective material should not be hung from the heater, or placed on or near the heater.
- Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the heater must be replaced prior to operating the heater.
- Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The heater should be inspected before each use and at least annually by a qualified service person.

### **OPERATION INFORMATION AND SAFETY:**

- Unit will operate at reduced efficiency below 40°F.
- Alert children and adults to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- Carefully supervise young children in the area of the heater.
- More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that control compartment burner and circulating air passageways of the heater be kept clean and free of debris and/or spider or insect nests.



# **RE-LIGHTING:**

For your safety, the control knob cannot be turned off without first depressing the control knob in the **PILOT** position and then rotating it to the **OFF** position.

- 1. Turn the control knob to **OFF**. Wait at least 5 minutes for gas to dissipate.
- 2. Repeat the steps under **LIGHTING INSTRUCTIONS** on the previous page.



### **DURING OPERATION:**

Flame should be mostly blue and yellow. If excessive flame or smoke is detected, turn off heater and consult "Troubleshooting" section of manual.



FOR YOUR SAFETY Heater will be hot after use. Handle with extreme care.



### **SHUT DOWN:**


- Turn control knob clockwise to OFF while depressing the knob.
   (Normally, burner may make a slight popping noise when extinguished).
- Turn cylinder valve clockwise to OFF and disconnect regulator when heater is not in use.

**NOTE:** After use, some discoloration of the emitter screen is normal.



# **AFTER OPERATION:**

- Turn gas control knob to OFF position.
- 2. Turn gas tank valve **OFF**.
- 3. Disconnect gas line.
- 4. Store heater upright in a secure location.



# **CARE AND MAINTENANCE**



To enjoy years of outstanding performance from your heater, make sure you perform the following maintenance activities on a regular basis. Before performing any maintenance always disconnect propane gas tank.:

### KEEP EXTERIOR SURFACES CLEAN.

- Use soapy water for cleaning. Never use flammable or corrosive cleaning agents. Permanent damage may occur if powder or solvent comes in contact with painted or plastic components on this heating unit.
- 2. While cleaning your unit, be sure to keep the area around the burner and control compartment dry at all times. Do not submerge the control valve assembly. If the gas control is submerged in water, do NOT use it. It must be replaced. Use a soft brush to get rid of the mild stains loose dirt and soil after the burner is completely cooled down. Wipe down with a soft cloth.
- 3. Air flow must be unobstructed. Keep controls, burner, and circulating air passageways clean. Signs of possible blockage include:
  - · Gas odor with extreme yellow tipping of
  - · Heater does NOT reach the desired temperature.
  - · Heater glow is excessively uneven.
  - Heater makes popping noise.
- 4. Spiders and insects can nest in burner or orifices. This dangerous condition can damage heater and render it unsafe for use. Clean burner holes by using a heavy-duty pipe cleaner. Compressed air may help clear away smaller particles.
- 5. Carbon deposits may create a fire hazard. Clean dome and burner screen with warm soapy water if any carbon deposits develop.
- 6. Harsh weather conditions may cause stubborn stains, discoloration and possibly rust pitting.

**Note:** In a salt-air environment (such as near an ocean), corrosion occurs more quickly than normal. Frequently check for corroded areas and repair them promptly.



# **TIP FOR STAINLESS STEEL MODELS:**

Use high-quality automobile wax to help maintain the appearance of your heater. Apply to exterior surfaces from the post down.

DO NOT apply to emitter screen or domes.



### FOR YOUR SAFETY

- Do NOT touch or move heater for at least 45 minutes after use.
- Reflector is hot to the touch.
- Allow reflector to cool before touching.

### STORAGE:

### Between uses:

- · Turn control knob OFF.
- · Disconnect LP source.
- Store heater upright in an area sheltered from direct contact with inclement weather (such as rain, sleet, hail, snow, dust and debris).
- If desired, cover heater to protect exterior surfaces and to help prevent build-up in air passages. Never leave LPG tank exposed to direct sunlight or excessive heat.

**Note:** Wait until heater is cool before covering.

### **SERVICE:**

Only a qualified service person should repair gas passages and associated components. Not using manufacturer approved or supplied parts/accessories may result in a defective condition and void the warranty of this heating unit.

**Caution:** Always allow heater to cool before attempting service.
